Minutes of a meeting of the Stocksbridge Town Council, held in the Council Chamber, Town Hall, The ARC, Stocksbridge on Thursday, 10th September 2009

77. To Receive Chairman's Remarks and Apologies for Absence
Apologies for absence were received from Cllr. M C Brelsford.
78. Stocksbridge Community Care Group The Chairman welcomed Carol Travis and Graham Helliwell, representatives from Stocksbridge Community Care Group, who had been invited to attend in order to update Councillors on the 'Friendly Visitors Scheme' launched earlier in the year. G Helliwell advised members that the Group was now a registered charity and was financially secure for the next six months. They were currently short of volunteers, with 14 fully trained volunteers on their books and a similar number of people requiring visitors. G Helliwell felt that the scheme was now an integral part of the community and hoped that they would be seen as a source of resource, and requested the assistance of the Town Council with possible contacts. Carol Travis reported that she had laid out the foundation of the scheme six months ago, sending out information packs to Health Care professionals, Doctors etc. To date she had received 19 referrals, had seen 16 and visited 15 of the 16. Nine of these people were visited regularly by the same volunteers and there had been a number of one-off visits ie shopping, return from hospital and one palliative care referral. C Travis noted that the scheme was now in need of more volunteers and to this end a coffee morning would be held on 28th September in Stocksbridge Library. Cllr. Mrs A E Brelsford asked what the volunteers were required to do. C Travis advised that volunteers brought lots of various skills and experience with them and she tried to match these with the requests received for visits. More often than not it was a case of providing social contact. Cllr. D L Lyons asked what was the age range of people requesting visits and asked if consideration had been given to university students as possible volunteers as universities had systems in place whereby students were encouraged to become involved in voluntary work. C Travis advised that the age range was 54-93 and that currently the majority of volunteers were mainly retired. Cllr A S Law asked where C Travis was based and noted that he had contact details of many volunteer groups, which he undertook to forward on to her. C Travis advised that she operated from Stocksbridge Library on a Wednesday morning, the remainder of her time being spent visiting and matching volunteers with requests for visitors. Cllr. J Clarkson stated that the Partnership Working Scheme was currently involving the Fire Cadets in assisting with fitting fire alarms. He undertook to pass this information to C Travis. C Travis commented on the benefits gained from the talk by the Police previously organised by Cllr. Clarkson. Cllr. Mrs W M Kaye queried whether the people requesting visitors had carers already. C Travis stated that some do and some don't, it was more a case of providing a different sort of service, more of a social visit.

C Travis noted that she had prepared a six month review of the service which was available to Councillors if they wished to see it. She undertook to email a copy to the Clerk who would then forward the report to members.

The Chairman thanked both Carol and Graham for attending the meeting.

79. Public Questions and Petitions

Mr I Enters, a resident of Hunshelf Park, reported that all the residents of Hunshelf Park had recently received a letter from Veolia threatening to refuse to empty their bins due to the poor condition of the road. Mr Enters advised that this was an unadopted road and noted that since receipt of these letters the residents had got together and formed the Hunshelf Park Community Group and works were currently in hand to improve the road. However, he felt it was strange to receive such letters from a service provider and not the City Council which is who they pay their Council Tax to and asked if the Town Council could represent the residents on this issue.

Cllr. Mrs A E Brelsford stated that it was a contracted out service and as such Veolia was responsible for how they ran it.

Cllr. A S Law stated that neither SCC, the local authority or Councillors were informed of issues. However, he stated that it was not good practice and requested that a letter be sent directly to Veolia, copying Environmental Services, SCC expressing the concerns of the Town Council at the thoughtless and insensitive way the residents had been contacted.

Cllr. Mrs A E Brelsford stated that it was great testament to the residents on what they had achieved to date.

Cllr. A S Law stated that unadopted roads were an issue and requested the Clerk to enquire what other unadopted roads there were in the area.

T Martin noted that following refusal of her planning application due to it being out of keeping due to the property being in an area of special character she had looked in detail at the UDP and discovered that this area extends to Ford Lane and Hunshelf. She therefore queried how the Dransfield Property development on the Outo Kumpo site had been approved to take out Ford Lane and asked if this had been taken into account by planning officers.

Cllr. Mrs A E Brelsford advised that the matter would be raised with Planning Department and noted that a meeting was to be held with Les Sturch on 9th October at which the matter would also be raised.

80. To Approve as a True and Correct Record the Minutes of the Meeting of the Town Council held on 9th July 2009

Minutes of the Town Council meeting held on 9th July 2009, copies of which had been circulated prior to the meeting were taken as read.

Proposed by Cllr. R Marsh-Smith, seconded by Cllr. A S Law and

RESOLVED:- That the minutes be confirmed and signed by the Chairman.

81. To Receive Remarks from the Minutes of the Town Council meeting held on 9th July 2009

With reference to item 38 e) second paragraph onwards – 57/58 Bus Services – Town Council 11th June 2009. The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from First advising that the proposed reduced service of the 57/58 have been suspended for the foreseeable future, noting however that the proposals may not have been as drastic as perceived due to the proposed introduction of the X57 which would have served the Unsliven Bridge/Smithy Moor/Garden Village area. If the proposal is resurrected then a representative from First would be happy to attend a meeting to discuss this further. This correspondence was noted.

The Clerk reported that she had subsequently received correspondence from SYPTE advising that following discussions between First, SCC and themselves with respect to the above proposed changes First has now agreed to withdraw them. This correspondence was noted.

Cllr. Mrs W M Kaye advised that at the North Rural Transport Forum meeting a request had been made to look at the feasibility of extending the tram feeder bus service to Smithy Moor due to the fact that the 57/58 service may be stopped in October.

With reference to item 49 – Steel Valley Way. The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from M Dransfield with respect to a request that further consideration be given to retaining the use of Ford Lane as a public right of way, enclosing a copy of an email received from a local resident in this respect and his response. M Dransfield states that he is very sympathetic to the needs of local people within the area and to this end has done his utmost to encourage engagement between Dransfield’s professional team and local residents and will continue to endeavour to keep everyone informed as the process moves forward. This correspondence was noted.

With reference to item 69 EPIP – Walkers Are Welcome. Cllr. D L Lyons asked if any progress had been made on the scheme. The Clerk advised that C Prescott had informed her that not much interest had been shown at a recent meeting and that there was no funding available, but undertook to obtain further feedback from C Prescott and report back.

82. To Receive and Approve Balances and Comparison of Spending Against Budget The Clerk reported that the details of the Balances & Comparison of Spending Against Budget had been previously circulated.

84. Bolsterstone Male Voice Choir The Clerk reported that she had received from Bolsterstone Male Voice Choir a copy of Touchstone (newsletter) Edition 6, July 2009. This correspondence was noted.
85. Application for Licence The Clerk reported that she had received notification of an application for an alcohol licence for Martin McColl Limited, at the premises of Deepcar Service Station, 74 Manchester Road, Deepcar from Sunday to Monday 0600 to 2200 hours. This correspondence was noted.
86. Valley In Bloom The Clerk reported that she had received from Valley In Bloom a copy of their Summer Newsletter. This correspondence was noted.
87. Bolsterstone Community Group The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from Bolsterstone Community Group thanking all those responsible for replacement of the bench on Stone Moor Road, also thanking the Town Council for their continued support, particularly that of Cllr. Dan Lyons who had assisted the Group in many ways since joining the Committee as the Town Council representative. This correspondence was noted.
88. Angela Smith MP The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from Angela Smith MP enclosing copies of surgery leaflets for display. This correspondence was noted.
89. South Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Authority The Clerk reported that she had received from the South Yorkshire Fire & Rescue Authority monthly reports for August and September 2009, copies of which had been previously circulated to members’. This correspondence was noted.

90. Rural Action Yorkshire The Clerk reported that she had received from Rural Action Yorkshire a copy of Country Air, Issue 112, Summer 2009. This correspondence was noted.
91. British Youth Council The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from the British Youth Council advising of free training courses taking place during the Autumn. This correspondence was noted.
92. Peak District National Park Authority The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from the Peak District National Park Authority advising of two planning surgeries taking place on 24th September and 13th October 2009 in Hathersage and Bakewell respectively. Also correspondence enclosing a CD requesting comments on the draft Recreation Strategy for the Peak District National Park, the deadline for which is 25th September 2009 and copies of Parishpeak, Issue 7, Summer 2009. This correspondence was noted.

96. Don Valley Railway The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from the Don Valley Railway a news update on the current position with regards to a possible rail link. This correspondence was noted.
97. CPRE The Clerk reported that she had received from CPRE a copy of Fieldwork, September 2009. This correspondence was noted.
98. Sheffield Environment Weeks The Clerk reported that she had received from Sheffield Environment Weeks notes of a meeting held on 21st July 2009. This correspondence was noted.
99. Bloor Homes The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from A Sykes providing an update on issues/concerns raised by Councillors at the July Town Council meeting to the proposed development by Bloor Homes and Merriman Limited on land between Manchester Road and Station Road, Deepcar, copies of which had been previously circulated to members.
100. Planning Inspectorate The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from the Planning Inspectorate advising that a local Inquiry will be held on 6th January 2010, commencing at 10.00 a.m. in the Town Hall, Stocksbridge regarding Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 Section 53, (Definitive Map and Statement) Modification Order (No.28) 2008. This correspondence was noted.
101. Clerks & Councils Direct The Clerk reported that she had received a copy of Clerks & Councils Direct, Issue 65, September 2009. This correspondence was noted.
102. Stocksbridge Community Care Group The Clerk reported that she had received from Stocksbridge Community Care Group an agenda for their AGM to be held on 18th September 2009 commencing at 10.00 a.m. in Stocksbridge Library. This correspondence was noted.

103. www.thamustbelocal.com The Clerk reported that she had received email correspondence from J Truelove inviting members to become part of the above community based website, created for local people to discuss local issues and life. It was requested that this information be circulated to all Councillors.
104. Department for Transport The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from the Department for Transport enclosing a draft order regarding the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 – Section 247 Proposed Stopping up of Highway at Ford Lane, Stocksbridge (Outo Kumpo works).

In view of the information provided by T Martin it was requested that the Clerk write to the Department of Transport, copying SCC advising that this was an area of special character, as defined in the UDP, also noting that correspondence had been sent to Planning Department to this effect.

105. Local Council Review The Clerk reported that she had received a copy of Local Council Review, Autumn 2009. This correspondence was noted.
106. Litter Bins The Clerk reported that she had received a request from a local resident for a litter bin to be sited on Bracken Moor. The Clerk noted that she had contacted Street Force requesting that they investigate the possibility of siting a litter bin at this location but had been informed by Jo Radley that Street Force had been stopped from siting any new bins at present due to a highways issue regarding the depth of service cables under the pavements. At present Street Force install a concrete slab, level with the highway, and bolt the bins to this but problems have arisen with service cables. Once this issue has been resolved then the request will be investigated. This correspondence was noted.
107. To Receive Verbal Reports from Members?
- a) Cllr. A S Law reported that he had attended the STEP Board meeting. He had also dealt with issues regarding fly tipping and been in contact with Stuart Smith regarding the forthcoming national cycling event, which was attracting competitors and visitors from all over the country.
- b) Cllr. J Clarkson advised that he had been in contact with Kerry Johncock regarding partnership agencies, crime prevention and community safety issues within the area and was pleased to note that there were no major problems with regard to gangs in the area.
- Cllr. Clarkson reported that he had attended the Planning Board meeting on 8th September and raised his objections with regard to the Bloor Homes application at Station Road, Deepcar. However, the application had been granted conditionally. He raised his concerns that a further possible 2000 people would be moving into the area and no contact had been made with the PCT regarding health/dental care provision. With regard to the mine water run-off Bloor Homes had stated that an agreement was in place for the Coal Authority to take over responsibility for this once the development was completed. However, on contacting the Coal Authority Cllr. Clarkson had been advised that it was not on their list of priorities and he had therefore requested V Faulkner to follow this up. With regard to the provision of a community facility Cllr. Clarkson noted that Bloor Homes had gifted a community building on land set aside for this purpose, however, he questioned whether Bloor Homes would be building this facility and stated it needed to be made a condition of the application.
- Cllr. Clarkson noted that highways issues had already been agreed but reiterated the concerns of the Town Council with regard to traffic flow issues.
- c) Cllr. K Davis reported that he had attended the Stocksbridge Community Forum meeting and had been in contact with Street Force on several occasions in an attempt to get gullies cleaned out on Manchester Road/Unsliven Road. He raised his concerns that issues such as this, raised by Councillors, were not being acted upon and undertook to forward the emails to the Clerk who was

requested to write to J Mothersole advising of the situation and asking that such requests be acted upon.

d) Cllr. D L Lyons was pleased to report that the telephone box at Bolsterstone had now been painted red.

Cllr. Lyons reported that further evidence had been requested with respect to breaches of covenant on land at New Mill Bank/Race Lane in order to assist with the case against the landowners.

Cllr. Lyons advised that he had attended the ARC meetings with regard to the burglar alarm issues which had resulted in a refit in the coming week. Hopefully this would resolve the problems.

Cllr. Lyons reported that he had attended the SVP Quarterly Management meeting, the Standards Board meeting and noted he had received correspondence advising that the Mottram/Tintwistle by-pass enquiry was now closed.

e) Cllr. R Marsh-Smith reported that he had dealt with issues regarding a dangerous street light, overgrown hedges and road safety issues at the top of Carr Road and had approached the Community Association with regard to traffic calming measures in this area.

f) Cllr. Mrs W M Kaye reported that she had attended several In Bloom meetings and noted that the Group would commencing clearing and re-planting all planters on 26/27 September.

Cllr. Kaye advised that she had attended the Sheffield Homes AGM, the North Rural Transport Forum meeting, at which it had been reported that a tram bus driver had been using his mobile phone whilst driving up the Bitholmes – subsequent action had been taken, the Community Health Forum meeting and had also met with Julia Mayfield regarding the orchids near the Steel Valley Walk at Deepcar, who was also hoping to make a return visit to look further at the river itself.
