93. STEP Business Centre

The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from STEP Business Centre informing of an informal Networking Business Breakfast on 28<sup>th</sup> July. This correspondence had been circulated to tenants in the building.

94. Public Rights of Way

The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from Public Rights of Way informing of an application to upgrade parts of Stocksbridge footpath 20 and 20a, known as Mucky Lane, to the status of bridleway based on historic documentary evidence. Copies of this correspondence had been previously circulated to members'.

The Clerk reported that she had received further correspondence from PROW enclosing more evidence to support the proposals following concerns raised by a Councillor. Copies of this correspondence had been previously circulated to members'.

Cllr.MW stated that this was an area of highly sensitive moorland, the most diverse in Yorkshire, with many rare animals and birds in situ which will be put under stress. It was a wet moorland, hence its name. Following further discussion it was felt that the current status of the PROW was unsuitable for horse traffic.

95. Penistone FM

The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from Penistone FM Local Radio Community station confirming that they formally launched broadcasting into the Stocksbridge area on 1<sup>st</sup> August and thanking the Town Council for their support in the application process. 104. SYMCA

The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from SYMCA informing of Mayor Oliver Coppard's campaigning for a fair funding deal for public transport in South Yorkshire. As part of this campaign, he is visiting some of the communities that have been hardest hit by service cuts and transport connectivity issues and is holding several public meetings. He will also be holding a series of virtual meetings for those unable to attend one of the in-person meetings, details of which had been previously circulated to Councillors.

The Clerk reported that she had received correspondence from A Holmes, Communications Officer, SCC which had been published in Look Local informing of decisions, specifically with respect to the Upper Don Trails project, one of ten projects across the Town that the Board was working to deliver alongside SCC. b) Cllr. KD reported that he would be undertaking the upgrading of the plaque at the entrance to the Scout hut on Nanny Hill and also the upgrade of the kitchen facilities/DDA works at the Scout hut following the grant given by the Town Council.

c) In the absence of Cllr.SA the Chairman read out a report of events she had attended:- Bolsterstone Archaeological Group AGM will be held in October; SA participated in a walk around Midhope including St James Church; UDAC held its first AGM; the Homegrown Festival commences on 30<sup>th</sup> September; STEP continues to do well with members of the Board supporting the new staff; Friday Drop In still has a few spare places; Stocksbridge Community Care Group AGM was well attended and more volunteers are always welcome, despite social prescribing it was noted that GPs do not always refer people who would benefit from the service – this was to be followed up.

Cllr. SA was still dealing with residents concerns regarding certain breeds of dog, drug use, anti-social behaviour; lots of complaints regarding bus services, grass not being cut in community areas and litter, particularly in gennels. Could litter picks be organised this Autumn involving young people.

Cllr. SA noted that there continued to be lots of questions about the Towns Fund with residents at the West end of town angry that they were not consulted about the possible changes to walks around Underbank as they would be most affected by any changes. Cllr. SA had asked B Horsman to arrange a Community Forum where the community could be updated.

112. Town Deal Trails Project  
The Chairman welcomed members of the Upper Don Trail Trust (UDTT) who wished to raise their concerns regarding the decision of the Towns Fund Board with regard to the Town Deal Trails Project, copies of correspondence from the group and A Holmes, Communications Officer, SCC had been previously circulated to members.  
The Chairman stated that both Stocksbridge Town Council and Bradfield Parish Council had been involved in the consultation process from the beginning but noted that the Town Council



had no direct power over the Towns Fund Board and queried what the UDTT hoped to achieve from this meeting.

T Bagshaw noted his involvement as a former Councillor in the Sustrans discussions and also as a founder member of the UDTT, working together with SCC to facilitate improvement of walks within the Valley.

M Corrigan, British Horse Society informed of his involvement with Highways, BMBC etc, and surprise when the project stalled.

T Hutton, local resident and trustee of UDTT noted the optimism of the group at obtaining funds from the Towns Board for the project and the huge support from residents, particularly with traffic increasing daily and more housing developments underway.

C Prescott, member of Stocksbridge Walkers are Welcome, Bradfield Parish Council Walkers are Welcome and UDTT.

S Ogden circulated correspondence and a map detailing the Sustrans proposals, noting updates at Wharncliffe Woods and Bloors development. In June 2022 UDTT were informed that the project had been within budget and locked down. Shortly thereafter they were informed that it would not be happening, with no further information forthcoming despite several attempts at contact.

UDTT understand that there are budget constraints but do not understand why the project has been stopped or the lack of consultation. The Board have announced an alternative project which does not contribute to active travel or connect to the trail.

UDTT are requesting transparency and to explore the way forward and ask that Stocksbridge Town Council use its influence to obtain consultation and information for the group and members of the public.

SO queried whether the Town Council was comfortable with what was happening on the Towns Fund Board, it was not right the way business was being conducted. Could the Town Council open up discussions as to why the Towns Fund Board have chosen the Underbank link and not others and facilitate talks to take the project forward. The bridge at Holme Farm was unreal but there was an opportunity to add funds to go into the project.

Cllr. MW stated that Cllr. JAG had been Chairman when the Sustrans project commenced and he had huge respect for her. Cllr. JAG was an esteemed colleague who had always supported the UDTT.

Cllr. KD stated that Cllr. JAG was a very avid member of the Town Council and suggested that the points made by UDTT be taken to the Towns Fund Board.

SO stated that the Towns Fund Board should be consulting with the Town Council as a stakeholder.

Cllr. JS stated that the Town Fund Board should be asked why the project had been paused, how the decision had been taken, evidence to support the decision and noting the disappointment of the public that the project had been abandoned.

Cllr. KD referred to paragraph 4 of the letter supplied by A Holmes which had been in Look Local which he felt required clarity and evidence as to why this decision had been taken.

Cllr. JW noted the rumours circulating within the Valley with residents, stating that the public should be kept informed of progress on a regular basis.

The Clerk noted that A Holmes was to attend a future Town Council meeting once there was more information on planning applications to report.

SO stated that Howard Vans also needed to be invited to attend.

The Chairman stated that the Town Council, as a statutory consultee, would raise these points with the Towns Fund Board and request transparency/clarity and evidence to support the decisions made which would be made available to the UDTT.

M Corrigan stated that as a statutory consultee the British Horse Society had not been informed, and neither had Sustrans.

SO advised that not all meetings of the Towns Fund Board were minuted and requested that they be asked to publish minutes in a more timely manner.

The Chairman thanked members of the UDTT for attending the meeting.
